


Brotherhood

4th June

The two day Lavender Festival was celebrated in Jammu and Kashmir's, Bhadarwah Valley. The Bhadarwah Valley is now known as the 'lavender capital of India'. This is because lavender is grown there in large quantities. The festival was organised by the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research-Indian Institute of Integrative Medicine (CSIR-IIIM). Lavender farming has helped many farmers to earn a higher income and to become more financially stable.

6th June

The government has given permission to 2000 Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS) to open special stores called Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Jan Aushadhi Kendras all over India. These stores are a part of Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana started by the Department of Pharmaceuticals under the Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilisers in November 2008. The purpose of these stores is to sell good quality medicines at low prices to everyone, especially people living in villages. This helps to reduce healthcare costs for everyone.

8th June

The Indian Navy took part in a special event that marked the 130th anniversary of the struggle against apartheid. Mahatma Gandhi, a great leader, started a fight against a system called apartheid or 7 June 1893 at the Pietermaritzburg Railway Station in South Africa. To honour this event, a big ship named INS Trishul from the Indian Navy went to Durban, South Africa. This visit also celebrates the 30-year friendship between India and South Africa.

10th June

IIT Kanpur has made a special tractor that runs on a fuel called Dimethyl Ether (DME). It is the first of its kind in India. This tractor's engine is better than regular diesel engines because it produces less pollution and works more efficiently. A group called Science and Engineering Research Board (SERB), which is part of the Department of Science and Technology supported IIT Kanpur in creating this tractor. This project also supports a program called the 'Methanol Economy' by NITI Ayog. The aim of this program is to reduce India's oil imports and to lower the pollution that harms the environment.

12th June

- 126^a birth anniversary of Ram Prasad Bismil was celebrated. He was a brave freedom fighter who fought against the British rule. He is remembered for both his courage and poems. He was among the most notable Indian freedom fighters who made India's freedom possible.
- The World Squash Federation (WSF) has chosen Chennai, Tamil Nadu to hold the 2023 Squash World Cup. In this tournament, there will be eight teams from different parts of the world playing in Chennai. The teams are from Australia, Colombia, Egypt, Hong Kong (China), India, Japan, Malaysia and South Africa.

13th June

The first Janjatiya Khel Mahotsav, organised by KIIT in Odisha, successfully ended with the participation of around 5,000 tribal athletes and 1,000 officials from 26 states. The event, supported by the Odisha Government and the Union Ministry of Culture, aimed to celebrate and promote tribal sports and unity. Karnataka performed well and secured the second position overall, excelling in Kabaddi and Volleyball. The event focused on bringing together sports and culture, tribal communities and sports, as well as the blending of tradition and modernity.

16th June

The High Courts of Allahabad and Delhi have recognised the right to change one's name as an essential part of the 'Right to Life' under Article 21 of the Indian Constitution. In a recent case, the Delhi High Court allowed two brothers to change their surname to escape caste discrimination. The courts emphasised that the right to one's identity is inherent in the Right to Life. The courts considered the right to change names as a form of freedom of speech and expression, which should not be unreasonably restricted by the state.

19th June

The Ministry of Culture has announced that the Gandhi Peace Prize for 2021 will be given to Gita Press, Gorakhpur. This is a significant honour that acknowledges Gita Press' remarkable contributions to society, economy, and politics through a non-violent approach inspired by Mahatma Gandhi. The Gandhi Peace Prize, established by the government in 1995 as a tribute to Gandhi's principles, has recognised many exceptional individuals and organisations for their remarkable work towards peace and progress.

22 June

Jammu and Kashmir's diverse wildlife has been given a wonderful addition with the official recognition of the Blue Pansy (Junonia Orithya) as the region's official butterfly. This important announcement, made by Dheeraj Gupta, Principal Secretary to the Government for the Department of Forest, Ecology and Environment, is a significant move towards conserving and safeguarding the natural beauty of this area. By designating the Blue Pansy as the official butterfly, efforts can be focused on preserving its habitat and promoting awareness about the rich biodiversity of Jammu and Kashmir.

3rd June

The European Space Agency (ESA) celebrated the 20th anniversary of the Mars Express spacecraft. They showed pictures from Mars during a live event (even though there is a 17-minute delay for the signals to come to Earth). ESA also shared a picture made from data collected by the High-Resolution Stereo Camera (HRSC), which showed the surface of Mars. The picture revealed that Mars has red iron oxide and mysterious blue marks from volcanic sands. The presence of clay and sulfate minerals suggest that there might have been water and good conditions for life in the past.

INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

15th June

The global mean temperature went above the 1.5-degree Celsius mark in early June, according to the ECMWF (European Centre for Medium-Range Weather Forecasts). This is the first time it has happened in the summer, as it usually occurs in winter and spring. The Paris Agreement on climate change, which came into force in 2016, says efforts will be made to limit the long-term rise of temperatures to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels. The World Meteorological Organization predicts a 66% chance of surpassing the threshold in at least one of the next five years. This shows how important it is to take action and reduce emissions to address the climate crisis together.

19th June

The Intersolar Europe 2023 exhibition was held in Munich, Germany. This exhibition provides a platform for industry leaders, manufacturers, suppliers, and service providers to exchange ideas and explore advancements in the solar industry. The event encourages collaboration and helps create new and innovative solutions (like solar pressure cooker and solar cars) for sustainable energy. It plays a big role in helping the world move towards cleaner and greener energy sources. The Indian Renewable Energy Development Agency (IREDA) also took part in this exhibition. IREDA's participation in 'Intersolar Europe 2023' highlights its commitment to contribute to the global Renewable Energy and encouraging sustainable development practices.

21st June

NASA and Boeing are working together to create an environment friendly plane that could transform the aviation industry. They are developing a special wing design called the Transonic Truss-Braced Wing, which has the potential to greatly reduce greenhouse gas emissions in smaller passenger aircraft. This collaboration aims to make air travel more sustainable and reduce its impact on the environment.

SPORTS

3rd June

The Khelo India University Games ended successfully at the IIT BHU campus in Varanasi. Punjab University became the overall champions this year. The closing ceremony was attended by Union Ministers, athletes and other dignitaries who paid tribute to the victims of the Balasore train accident. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi started these Games to find talented players and encourage sports in India. There were 131 universities participating and 11 new ames records were set.

9th June

India performed very well at the Asian U20 Athletics Championships in South Korea. Sunil Kumar won a gold medal in the men's decathlon, Pooja earned a silver medal in women's high jump and Bushra Khan won silver in the women's 3000m race. India also won a bronze medal in the women's 4x100m relay. Siddharth Choudhary won gold in men's Shot Put, Shivam Lohakare won silver in Javelin throw, and Sharuk Khan earned silver in the men's 3000m steeplechase. In total, India won 19 medals (6 gold, 7 silver and 6 bronze) and finished third on the overall medals tally, after Japan and China.

11" June

- Australia won the ICC World Test Championship by defeating India in an exciting
 final, at The Oval. They won by a big margin of 209 runs. Travis Head and Steve Smith
 played amazingly well, scoring centuries in the first innings. This victory is special
 because Australia became the first men's team in the world to win ICC world titles in all
 three formats of cricket. Scott Boland bowled exceptionally well. Australia's strong
 batting lineup played a big role in their success throughout the Championship.
- Novak Djokovic won his 23rd Grand Slam title by defeating Casper Ruud in the French Open Final. He surpassed Rafael Nadal and became the first man to win each of the four major tournaments three times. The prize money for the tournament was €43.9 million, with Djokovic earning €2,300,000 as the winner. In the women's singles, Iga Świątek was the champion. The French Open is a famous tennis tournament played on clay courts and has a long history dating back to 1891. Many great players have competed in this tournament.
